

## The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD 2004)

The IMD 2004 is the most detailed and comprehensive investigation of deprivation and disadvantage across England to date. The concept of multiple deprivation used within IMD 2004 is based upon the idea of distinct dimensions or aspects of deprivation that can be identified and measured separately. The IMD 2004 is made up of seven domains, or types, of deprivation. Each individual domain also allows a further breakdown into several sub-domains, or sub-types, of deprivation. The seven main areas of deprivation and their sub-types of deprivation included in this report are:

- **Income Deprivation**, including
  - Income Deprivation affecting Older People*
  - Income Deprivation affecting Children*
- **Employment Deprivation**
- **Education, Skills and Training Deprivation**, including
  - Skills*
- **Health Deprivation and Disability**
- **Barriers to Housing and Services**, including
  - Wider Barriers (e.g. homelessness, access to owner occupation)*
  - Geographical Barriers (e.g. road distance to key services)*
- **Living Environment Deprivation**, including
  - Indoors Environment (e.g. poor quality housing)*
  - Outdoors Environment (e.g. air quality)*
- **Crime**

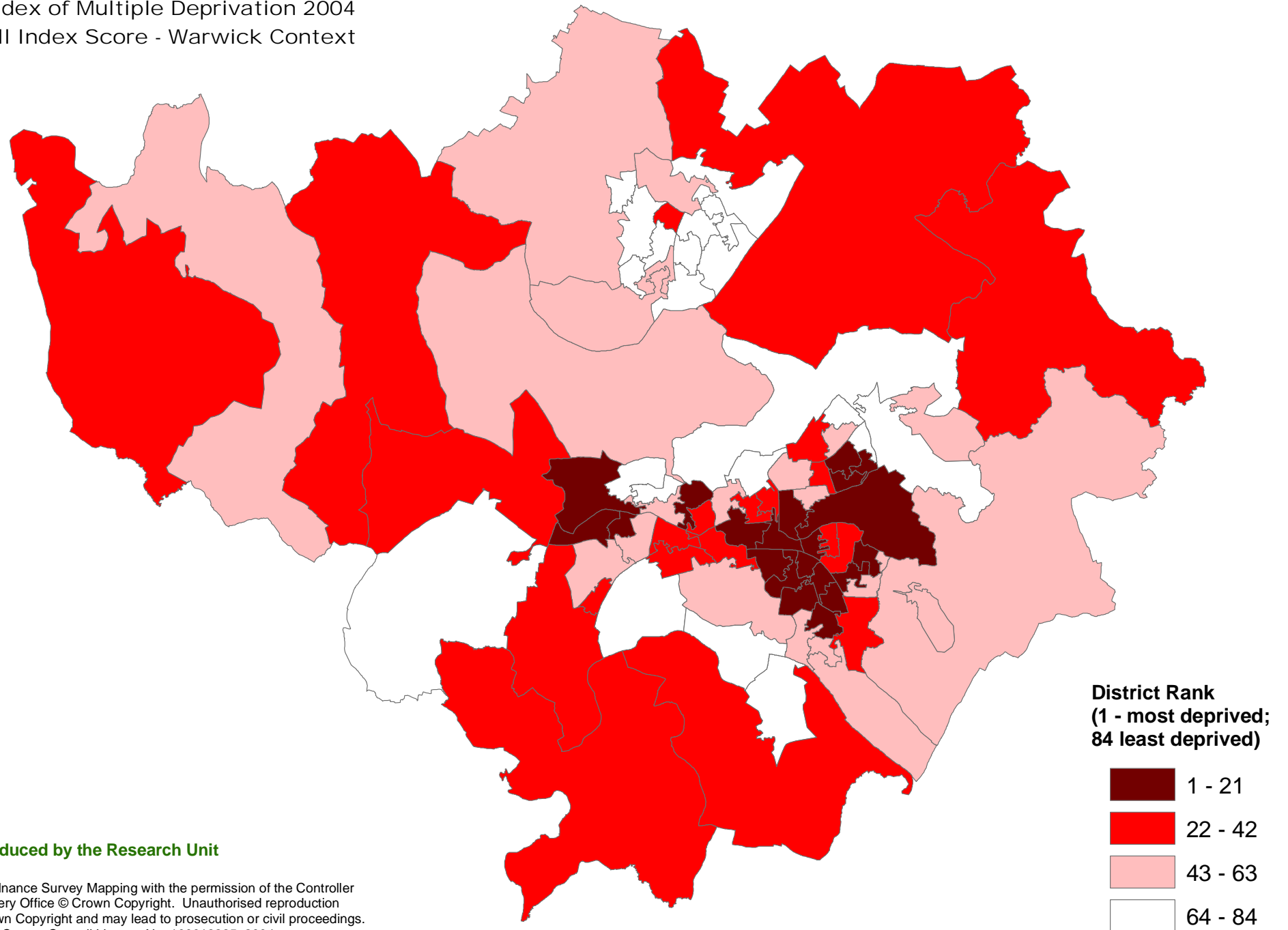

### **Warwick District in the National Context**

- Based on the overall index the most deprived Super Output Area in Warwick is in the east of Crown ward, Leamington in the Lillington area. This is the only Warwick, and South Warwickshire, SOA to feature in the 20% most deprived SOAs in England.
- 3 further SOAs feature in the 30% most deprived of SOAs in England. These are within the Packmores area of Warwick West, the very South East of Brunswick ward, Leamington and the Kingsway area of western Brunswick ward, Leamington.

- 8 Warwick district SOAs feature in the 30% most income deprived SOAs in England. These 8 SOAs are within Lillington (Crown ward), Brunswick and Sydenham (Willes ward).
- The most employment deprived SOA in Warwick district is the Lillington East area. This SOA is significantly more employment deprived than any other SOA in Warwick district and is the only SOA in Warwick district to feature in the 30% most employment deprived SOAs in England.
- 8 Warwick district SOAs feature in the 30% most education, skills and training deprived SOAs in England. These are within Brunswick, Lillington and Sydenham areas of Leamington and Packmores/The Cape areas of Warwick.
- The most health deprived Warwick SOA is the Lillington East SOA and features in the 20% most health deprived in England. A further 3 SOAs feature in the 30% most health deprived SOAs in England. 2 are in the Old Town area of Leamington and another in the Sydenham.
- 3 Warwick SOAs feature in the 1% most access to services and housing deprived areas in England. These areas are: Wroxhall, Hasely & Honiley (which ranks 45<sup>th</sup> out of 32, 482 SOAs nationally), Lapworth South, Bushwood, Lowsonford & Rowington (ranks 90<sup>th</sup> out of 32,482 SOAs nationally) and Stoneleigh (119<sup>th</sup>) all of which are SOAs within Warwick district.
- 31 Warwick SOAs in total feature in the 30% most access to services and housing deprived areas in England.
- 9 Warwick district SOAs feature in the 30% most crime deprived SOAs in England, including 1 – Milverton South East – in the 20% most crime deprived in England. This area is, undoubtedly, influenced by Leamington Railway station and the nightlife around Spencer St and the bottom end of the Parade. Other SOAs feature due to the presence, for example, of the Longbridge Island motorway services and Leamington town centre.
- 4 Warwick district SOAs feature in the 30% most living environment deprived SOAs in England. 3 of these SOAs including Old Town North West (from the Railway Bridge along High St and Radford Rd) rank in the 20% most living environment deprived SOAs in England.
- 9 Warwick SOAs feature in the 30% most deprived SOAs in England on the child poverty measure. The most deprived – Lillington East – features in the 20% most deprived on this measure. The other areas are in Brunswick, Lillington, Old Town, the Sydenham and an area in Warwick West between Goldsmiths Ave and Shakespeare Ave.
