Meet at Leamington Spa Town Hall which is in the lower Parade (by Queen Victoria statue).

Local buses stop near the Town Hall.

2. The Royal Naval Association

Originally a drill hall transformed to a comfortable riverside club with the largest ballroom in Leamington Spa. The Association offers the largest display of naval memorabilia in the area, dating back to the Second World War, together with a detailed history of the Royal Naval Association in Leamington Spa.

Riverside is adjacent to Adelaide Bridge, next to a public car park.

3. All Saints Church

Large French style Gothic parish church built between 1843-1902, with fragments of the medieval church, largely rebuilt to accommodate the growth of the spa town. Architects J G Jackson, with the vicar Dr John Craig, T C Barry and Sir Arthur Blomfield. Stained glass by Chance of Birmingham. Flower Festival over the weekend.

In Victoria Terrace adjacent to Bath Street.



4. St. Mary's Church

St Mary's Road, Leamington Spa

Designed in 1838/39 by J G Jackson with almost entirely stucco finish, including the tower. Fascinating interior has a gallery and contemporary painted panels by international artist Mo Enright, either side of the altar.

Modern church hall is adjacent.

St Mary's Road is off Radford Road.



5. The Mission

George Street, Leamington Spa

Built in 1828 by John Russell and Mitchell as a Roman Catholic Church (until 1864). Attended by Napoleon III during his stay in Leamington Spa. Greek revival building with interior carefully restored for use as Seventh Day Adventist Church. Tour Guides available.

George Street is off Radford Road/High Street.



6. Leamington Tennis Court

Bedford Street, Leamington Spa

Pre Book Venue

Guided tours of Leamington Spa's real tennis court. Built in 1846/7 by Jackson of Leamington Spa. Active real tennis club in a fine 19th Century building.

7. St Peter's RC Church

Dormer Place, Leamington Spa

A fine example of a large mid-19th Century Roman Catholic Church. Originally built in 1862 - 1864 by Henry Clutton of London and restored and embellished after a fire in 1884. Includes work by Hardman and Co, Minton and Pugin. Gothic revival with tall square Venetian style west tower, and fine interior. Attached Presbytery (not open). (See also the George Street Mission which was the former RC church in Leamington Spa).
Dormer Place, adjacent to the Pump Room Gardens.

9. Historic Ironwork Walk

The church was rebuilt by Sir William Wilson 1694-1704 after the destruction of the medieval church in the fire of Warwick of 1694. This curious building has much Gothic spirit. There is a Norman crypt and a fire monument in the Beauchamp Chapel.

26. Guy's Cliffe House

Stunning ruin of 18th and 19th Century country house on the banks of the River Avon, is rarely open to the public. Ancient site has a cave associated with Guy of Warwick and a medieval chapel founded as an oratory by St Dubritius. Now owned by the Freemasons. Ruins not accessible. Limited parking in grounds.

27. Judges House

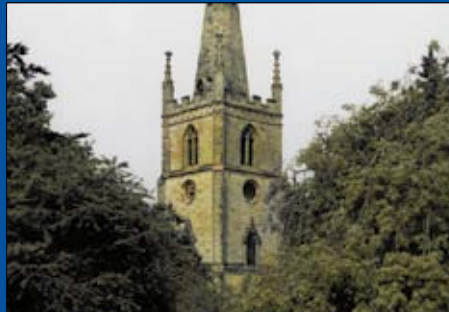

West Tower built in 1748 by J Collins. Main church rebuilt by Thomas Johnson of Warwick in Gothic Style. Chancel added in 1869/70 in decorated style of John Gibson.

29. Quaker Meeting House

High Street, Warwick

A chance to see and explore a character property that is not always easy to visit. Rebuilt in 1695 after the fire of Warwick in 1694 and extended in mid 18th Century. There will be a small display about Quakers and the history of this Meeting House with members available to answer questions. Cafe open Saturday morning only. Tea and coffee served on Sunday afternoon. The attractive garden will also be open.

Opposite the Lord Leycester Hospital, High Street in Central Warwick.



30. Alderson House

23 High Street, Warwick

An opportunity to view a beautiful, 18th Century, listed Georgian Building in the centre of Warwick, with a fine staircase.

Now used as Masonic Rooms.

High Street runs east west through central Warwick.

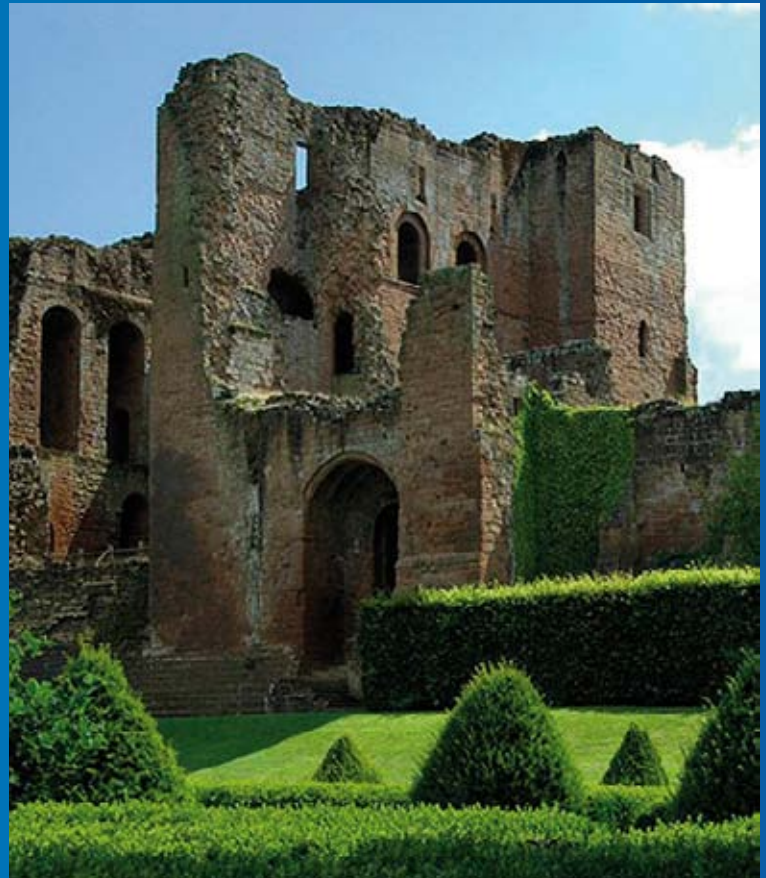

Within Abbey Fields adjacent to St Nicholas churchyard.



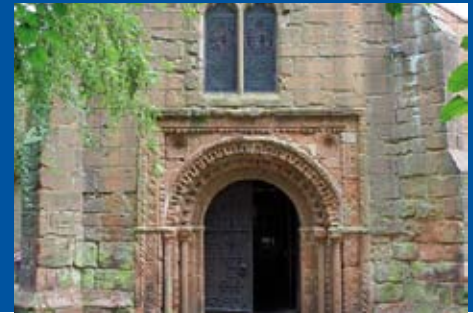
32. Guided Walk

St Francis is a large late 20th Century Roman Catholic Church, in a distinctive Romanesque style in a town centre location.

Warwick Road is the main A452 North South road in Central Kenilworth.



35. St Augustine's Church

St Augustine's is a small Roman Catholic Church designed by A.W Pugin in 1840. Decorated style built of red brick with stone dressings. Peaceful location.

Beehive Hill is located between Fieldgate Lane and Clinton Lane on the North Side of Kenilworth.

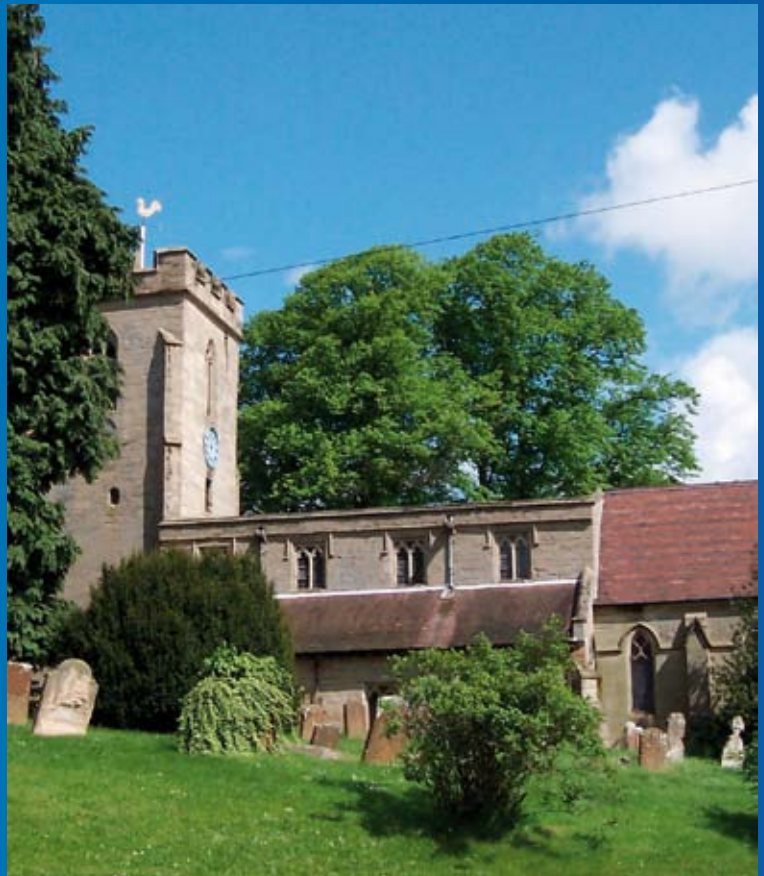

15th Century House surrounded by a moat set in beautiful gardens. Restored Elizabethan Interiors with Jesuit priest holes and 19th Century Catholic Chapel.

41. St Margaret's Church

Fascinating 13th Century Sandstone Church with 19th Century additions. Wooden Porch and small wooden Bellcote, with massive buttress on west wall. Peaceful location within the hamlet of Hunningham.

42. St Peter's Church

A church on this site was recorded in Domesday. The perpendicular stone tower, dating from the 14th Century, is pockmarked with shot from the civil war period. The rest of the church was rebuilt in 1844. There are several fine memorials and a rare churhing pew. Joseph Arch, MP and founder of the Agricultural Workers Union is buried in the churchyard. Exhibition. Refreshments available.

Barford is on the Stow Road south of Warwick.



43. St John The Baptist Church

Church of St John the Baptist, Wasperton. Peaceful location. Small church remodelled by G G Scott in 1847 incorporating earlier building of 1736, pulpit of 16th Century, and 18th Century wrought iron communion rail. Timber porch and bellcote in spirelet. Two windows by Pugin. Guides available.

Wasperton is located off the Stow Road to the west of Warwick.



44. St John the Baptist Church

Church Lane, Baginton

Fascinating 13th Century sandstone Church with central spirelet. Interior has very fine 15th Century brass to Sir William Bagot and his wife Margaret together with 17th and 18th Century mural tablets and 18th Century paneling. Guides in the church.

Refreshments at the adjacent Lucy Price room. Parking available.

Baginton village is to the south of Coventry. Baginton Castle close by.

The church dates from 12th to 15th Century and stands overlooking timber framed houses in the village. All the stained glass windows have local historical interest, including work by Kingsley, William Morris and Phillip Webb. The church also has remains of medieval wall paintings. Guide available and light refreshments.
