GRANT ELIGIBLE WORKS

1. Re-roofing in natural materials to match the original roofing materials of the property.
2. Repairs to windows, which are of a traditional style. Replacement windows may be considered where repair is no longer viable.
3. Repointing brickwork or stonework in a traditional manner for re-rendering walls where render has become defective.
4. Replacement of architectural features such as missing mouldings, missing chimney stacks, replacement of unsympathetic doors and windows.
5. Repairs to chimney stacks, parapets and other high level details and timber infestation eradication (grants may be at the discretion of the Council, depending on the significance of the work to the property).
6. Replacement or reinstatement of traditional boundary treatments (such as cast iron railings).
7. Redecoration of itself is not normally grant eligible as this is considered to be maintenance work. Consideration may be given to redecoration of items affected by other grant aided works.

WORKS WHICH ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR GRANTS

1. General items of maintenance such as broken windows are not eligible.
2. Internal repairs generally unless they are of a structural nature which affects the outside of the property would not be eligible.
3. Re-wiring, new bathroom fittings, kitchen fittings and any alterations to the building would not be grant eligible.
