design awards

Warwick District Council are sponsoring once again a District-wide Design Award Scheme.

The award scheme will cover Kenilworth, Whitnash and all Villages in Warwick District. It will not include Leamington Spa or Warwick which have their own individual schemes.

Why Have These Design Awards?

The District Council will make awards to recognise achievements to improve the quality of the physical environment within the administrative area of Warwick District Council. The District includes a wide range of environmental characteristics which are important both to visitors and people living within the district. The maintenance of the physical characteristics of the environment to a high standard is a very important way of enhancing and maintaining the environment for present and future generations. This may be achieved by new and sensitively designed buildings, the restoration of an existing building or the enhancement of the natural environment.

What Schemes Can Be Entered For The Awards

Nominations for awards will be considered in the following categories:-

- A new single building within town, village or rural area.
- A group of new buildings within town, village, or rural area.
- Restoration of an historic building.
- The conversion or restoration of an existing building.
- The restoration of a public park or other public space.
- The restoration or construction of a private garden.
- Any project which demonstrates a high standard of ecological consideration.

The subject of the nominations should be within the towns of Kenilworth and Whitnash or the following parishes within the District:-

Ashow, Baddesley Clinton, Baginton, Barford, Beausale, Blackdown, Bishops Tachbrook, Bubbenhall, Budbrooke, Bushwood, Cubbington, Eathorpe, Guys Cliffe, Haseley, Hatton, Honiley, Hunningham, Leek Wootton, Lapworth, Norton Lindsey, Old Milverton, Offchurch, Radford Semele, Rowington, Sherbourne, Shrewley, Stoneleigh, Wappenbury, Wasperton, Weston-under-Wetherley and Wroxall.

- Awards will be made for the nomination which, in the opinion of the assessors panel, adds most to the quality of the environment and the enjoyment of the people living within and visiting the district.
- Nominations will be assessed during July, and the winners in each category will be announced during August. Each winner will receive a certificate, which will be presented at the Royal Priors Shopping Centre on 4th September prior to the District Councils Heritage Day which will be on the 5th September.
- The awards are open to all schemes which have been completed between 1st June 2005 and 1st June 2009. Projects which are not completed by 1st June 2009 cannot be considered but may be eligible for a future awards scheme.

Who Will Judge The Awards?

The assessors panel for all nominations will include the following:-

- The Chair of Warwick District Council or a nominated Representative.
- A representative from the Conservation and Design Section of Warwick District Council Planning Department.
- An independent assessor
