Audible Intruder Alarms

Noise from audible intruder alarms are a frequent cause of complaint.

If, upon investigation, the noise is judged to be a statutory nuisance, legal action may be taken by the Council against those responsible for the noise.

It may also be necessary to obtain a warrant to enter your property and take whatever action is necessary to silence the alarm. The costs of this would be re-charged to the persons responsible.

Please follow the simple guidance given below to ensure you do not cause a nuisance to your neighbours, and your alarm remains an effective deterrent against burglary.

ALWAYS:

- 1. Ensure your alarm is properly installed and maintained to prevent false alarms.
- 2. Ensure your alarm cuts out after 15 to 20 minutes, perhaps reverting to visual indicator.
- 3. Maintain at least 2 keyholders who can visit to disable the alarm within 20 minutes of notification.
- 4. Inform Warwick District Council of the name, address and telephone number of the keyholders on the attached form.

Remember to notify the Council of changes to this information.
