Summary of Collections

- Approx 47,000 bins
- Approx 4500 weekly sacks
- APPROX 8000 on bulk collections

- Majority of properties have
 - 1 x 180 litre refuse bin.
 - 1 x 240 litre green/food bin.
 - Boxes and bags for recycling
