## This trail is designed to be used with a smartphone.

Each place on this self-guided tour is connected to a person or people who have helped to shape Royal Leamington Spa. Many of these people are only known in Leamington, but some had an impact on a national, and even a world stage. From Benjamin Satchwell, who opened the first commercial bath house in Leamington, to world middleweight boxing champion Randolph **Turpin and 20th century** abstract artist Sir Terry Frost, follow the trail to find out more.

The trail forms a circular route around Leamington's town centre and you can start at any stop you like. The suggested route will take about an hour and a half to complete. It is step free, but there are some uneven surfaces and steep hills. Alternatively. you can just visit the stops that take your interest.



At each point on the trail scan the QR code on the map.

Place AR Object to position it. The audio will start automatically on Android phones, but you need to tap the object with iOS.














