EXAMINATION OF THE WARWICK NET ZERO CARBON DEVELOPMENT PLAN DOCUMENT (DPD) – NEXT STEPS

Following the examination hearing sessions held during the week of 6 March 2023, I now write to you to set out the next stages of the examination process and the further work sought from the Council to ensure the soundness of the Warwick Net Zero Carbon DPD.

Firstly, I would like to thank the Council's Team for the way in which the hearing sessions were approached, arranged and conducted. This enabled the hearing sessions to take place as smoothly, effectively and efficiently as possible and for that I am grateful.

The principal purpose of this letter, as I indicated at the close of the hearing sessions, is to set out what is required from the Council for the examination to progress effectively. The intention therefore is to provide the Council with a clear structure of what is required of it and when it is to be provided during the coming weeks and to outline a forward programme for the remainder of the examination process.

To do this, I attach two schedules which identify actions, including additional work, for the Council to complete and an indicative timetable for the remainder of the examination. Many, but not all, of the actions and tasks were identified at the close of the hearing sessions. Nonetheless, for clarity, I have set out the reason(s) why <u>all</u> of these are required. The two schedules are as follows:

- Annex A List of Actions and Tasks for the Council arising during and after the hearing sessions with a completion date either identified or set.
- Annex B Indicative Timetable for the next stages of the Examination (Draft Timescale)

The schedule in Annex A provides detail on the actions and tasks for the Council which have been identified during and following the examination hearings. The Council is tasked with completing these over the coming weeks, prior to the final consideration of any proposed main modifications to the submitted DPD that will be required for soundness being consulted upon. All of these matters should be addressed and completed by the dates identified in the schedule and the Council is asked to ensure that this is the case. Where the Council considers that this will not be possible, it should set out the reasons why as soon as possible.

The schedule in Annex B sets out an <u>indicative</u> timetable for the next stages of the examination which the Council and other interested parties may find helpful. It is important to stress that this timetable may change as a result of the outcomes of the actions and tasks that have been set. However, at this stage, I consider this to be a reasonable timeline for the remainder of the examination.

Main Modifications

From what I have seen and read to this point in the examination, it is evident that main modifications to the submission DPD will be required to be made for reasons of soundness, in accordance with paragraph 35 of the NPPF. Therefore, it will be necessary to undertake a period of consultation on the identified proposed main modifications in due course. Over the coming weeks, I anticipate that the Council and myself will liaise regularly to finalise the Schedule of Proposed Main Modifications and that this will develop and emerge from the actions and tasks identified in Annex A to this letter. I will be setting out my initial schedule of proposed main modifications to the Council shortly as a starting point towards finalising the schedule prior to public consultation.

Explanatory Note on Build Cost Uplift

I have taken account of the responses received with regard to the Council's Explanatory Note which was issued on the 9 March 2023 [EXAM 11] relating to the Council's approach, methodology and calculation of the cost uplifts identified for residential buildings (3%) and non-residential buildings (6%). My consideration of these matters and the points raised will be set out in my final report. However, I would be grateful if the Council could provide a written response to the points raised in the two recent representations made by Barton Willmore (EXAM11A] and Savills [EXAM11B] on the Explanatory Note, particularly (but not solely) concerning suggested conflicts within the Council's evidence and the margin for error in the calculated build costs.

I trust that you find this letter and the attached schedules helpful. Should you have any queries regarding the matters identified please raise these via the Programme Officer, Ian Kemp. I look forward to hearing from you at your earliest opportunity with regard to the points I have set out above. Please ensure that a copy of this letter is placed in the examination document library and notified on the examination website.
