Flower displays and occasional organ music. Cards by local artists on sale. Prayer and reflection stations especially created for visitors who would value a peaceful and quiet interlude.

#### **POLISH CENTRE**

54 High Street, CV31 1LW

Leamington Spa's first Town Hall and Police Station, designed by Russell and opened in 1830, has been the Polish Centre since 1968. Visitors will be able to see the original Council Chamber, Queen Victoria's balcony and the upper part of the ballroom, now used as a Roman Catholic Chapel.

Visitors are not required to book in advance; there is also no disabled access to the building.

#### **COURT HOUSE**

Take a tour of the Court House Designed and built in 1725 by Francis Smith, . The Court House replaced a medieval tavern, one of the few buildings which survived the Great Fire of Warwick in 1694.

#### **GUY'S CLIFFE CENTRE (SSSI)**

Coventry Road, CV34 5YD

Set in eight acres of parkland this ancient location is where the legendary Guy of Warwick lived and died as a hermit. The site was also a Saxon Hermitage dating from the mid 6th century and is of Triassic geological special scientific interest. Come and view Guys Cliffe ruin, which is unaccessible, complete with St Mary Magdalen Chapel, which is currently used as a Masonic Temple. The whole site is owned by the Freemasons.

#### **GUY'S CLIFFE WALLED GARDEN**

Come and explore the fascinating history of Guy's Cliffe walled gardens, dating from the 1770s and supplying the Guy's Cliffe estate until the 1940s. 250 years later - the garden is now supplying its fresh fruit and vegetables to the local foodbanks and night shelter; however, some of the produce will also be available to buy over the Heritage weekend.

#### **MARKET HALL MUSEUM**

Hear about the fascinating history of the Market Hall building, central to life in Warwick since 1670, and the highlights of the museum collection on display. From the infamous Warwickshire Bear to the amazing South Warwickshire Ancient Roman coin hoards. Tours are ideal for 12+ years.

#### ST NICHOLAS CHURCH

#### **WARWICK SOCIETY TOWN WALKS**

Starting from Shire Hall, Market Place, Warwick

Warwick has a distinctive mix of mediaeval buildings and architecture of the early Georgian period, rebuilt after the Great Fire 1694. Members of the Warwick Society will lead walks around the historic town centre, talking of how it has evolved over the centuries, of its present condition, and of what its future might hold.

Walks start from Shire Hall, Market Place, Warwick and last around 75 minutes. Wheelchair users will be very welcome to join in; the route will be over a mile long, following pavements and road crossings.

#### **ALL SAINTS CHURCH, LADBROKE**

#### **BADDESLEY CLINTON**

Rising Lane, Baddesley Clinton, B93 0DQ

The magic of Baddesley Clinton comes from its secluded, timeless setting deep within its own parkland. From refuge to haven, this atmospheric moated manor house has been a sanctuary since the 15th century. Discover Baddesley's late medieval, Tudor and 20th-century histories and uncover its stories, from hiding persecuted Catholics in its priest's holes, to the history of the Ferrers family who lived at Baddesley for more than 500 years. The peaceful gardens include fish pools, walled garden and a lakeside walk, perfect for a tranquil stroll.

#### **PACKWOOD HOUSE**

Packwood Lane, Lapworth, B94 6AT

Surrounded by beautiful gardens and countryside, Packwood was described by a guest in the 1930s as 'a house to dream of, a garden to dream in'. Lovingly restored at the beginning of the 20th century by Graham Baron Ash, you can discover the detail behind the man, his passion for collecting and his collection. The gardens include brightly coloured, 'mingled style' herbaceous borders, famous sculpted yews and an 18th-century gentleman's kitchen garden.

#### **CHURCH OF ST MARY, HASELEY**

Firs Lane, Haseley, CV35 7LS

This stunning Grade I listed medieval church with box pews is located in an idyllic setting close to Warwick.

#### **BAGOT'S CASTLE**

Church Road, Baginton CV8 3AR

14th Century ruin steeped in English history set in ten acre site with woodland, paths, river walks, ponds, Bagot Goats and picnic areas. Education Visitor Centre with artefacts from the castle. WWII tank test track.

Bagot's Castle is located at the end of Church Road, Baginton, CV8 3AR just past the church which is on the right as you go down Church Road. Parking is in our car park at the end of Church Road - overflow car parking at the Blacksmith Shop just as you enter Church Road/Signs will be in place.

#### ST ANNE'S CATHOLIC CHURCH, WAPPENBURY

Church Lane, CV33 9DW

St Anne's Catholic church sits on an old Roman encampment with a rich history going back to the 18th century. The church was completely restored in 2014 using archive records and specialist craftsmen. It is a beautiful country parish church.

## ST JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH, WASPERTON CV35 8EB

Small church remodelled 1847 by GG Scott includes a 16th Century pulpit an 18th Century wrought iron communion rail, a timber porch, bellcote with spirelet and two Pugin designed windows.

#### ST MARGARETS CHURCH, HUNNINGHAM

School Lane, CV33 9DS

Built in 1216 so that residents could attend church when the river crossing to Wappenbury was flooded. The church was constructed with Ashlar sandstone with Victorian additions and a wooden bell tower. The West wall consists of a huge exterior buttress and a long pointed light containing the Millennium window. The font is white sandstone from the 14th century The church is rural in delightful countryside

#### ST MARY'S CHURCH, CUBBINGTON

Church Lane, CV32 7JT

A chance to visit this Grade I listed Norman church dating from the 12th century with exceptional stained glass windows and surrounded by an award winning churchyard. Bells were hung in the church tower in the early 1600s and have been rung regularly ever since.

#### ST PETER'S CHURCH, BARFORD

Church Street, CV35 8BS

There has been a church on the site since Saxon times. The present church was re-built in the 1840s save for the Tower which is 14th century .lt houses a ring of 6 bells and careful examination of its exterior shows bullet holes left during the Civil War. In the churchyard lies buried Joseph Arch (1826-1919) who was born in a nearby cottage. He founded the National Union of Agricultural Labourers. His tomb is marked with an obelisk.

#### ST CHADS CHURCH, BISHOP'S TACHBROOK

CV33 9RJ

The building has its roots deep in history, parts of which go back to the 12th Century. The aisle and tower were added in the late 14th and early 15th Century. Two of the beautiful stained glass windows are of special interest. The first is in memory of Charles Kingsley the other is an early work of William Morris
