BYELAWS with respect with PLEASURE GROUNDS

made on 18th April, 1977

A BYELAW

prohibiting the playing of golf with a hard golf ball
in the areas to which the above Byelaws relate
made on 15th January, 1982.



BYELAWS made under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875, Section 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906, Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906, and Section 19(1) of the Warwick Corporation Act 1948 by the Warwick District Council with respect to pleasure grounds.

1. The above mentioned series of Byelaws made by the Warwick District Council with respect to pleasure grounds on 18th April 1977 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on 23rd June 1977 is hereby amended by the addition of the following Byelaw and the said Byelaws shall be read and construed accordingly:-

“20(A). A person shall not in the pleasure ground drive, pitch or chip a hard golf ball (except on land set aside by the Council as a golf course, golf driving range, golf practice area or putting course)”
