



Warwickshire Your Say on Community Safety Survey 2024 - Warwick District

The Safer Warwickshire Partnership Board commissioned a survey to better understand current community safety issues and any concerns that residents, and those who work or study in Warwickshire, may have.

The findings from the survey will enable the Board to develop its community safety services, with the aim of increasing how safe residents feel and promoting action that can be taken to help increase feelings of safety. They will inform the setting of local community safety priorities from the autumn onwards.

The survey was conducted from the **8th July 2024 to the 4th August 2024** with **264** responses received from Warwick District residents and **11** responses received from people working or studying in Warwick, but not living in Warwickshire. Responses were received from 0.2% of the Warwick District population aged 16+ (126,688).

Analysis has been conducted by the Community Safety Partnership Analysts in the Business Intelligence team and focuses on resident responses only. This report can be read alongside the county wide report, which is available from the BI team - businessintelligence@warwickshire.gov.uk.



It is important to note that the survey was open to everyone in Warwickshire via an online tool and the results do not provide the views of a representative sample of the population. Although there was widespread promotion across the county throughout the survey period, some groups are over-represented in the demographic data.

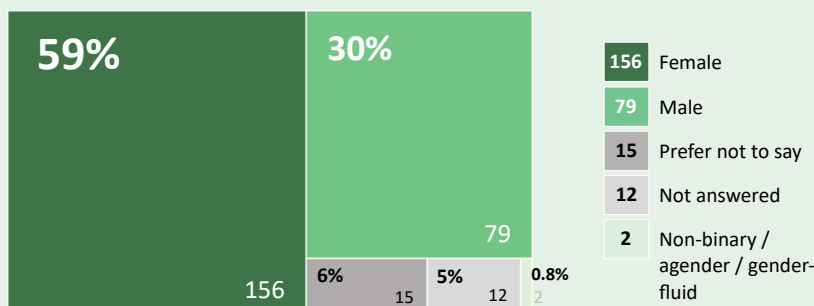

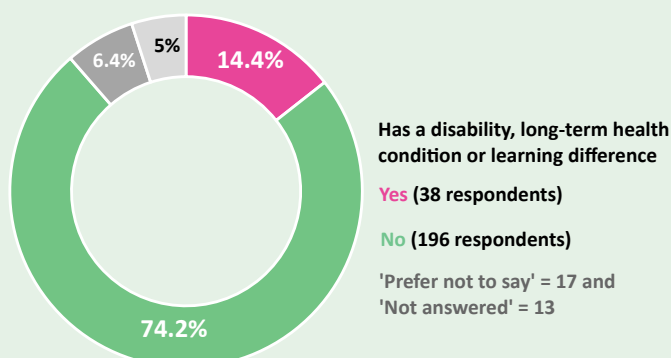

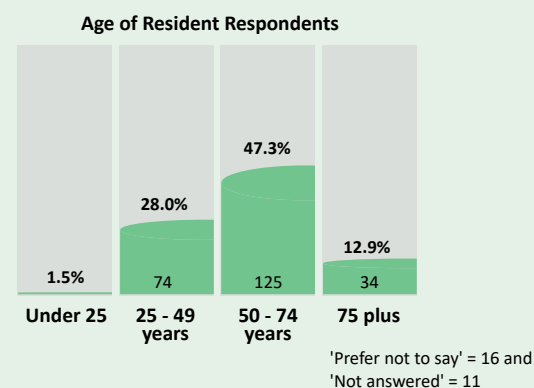

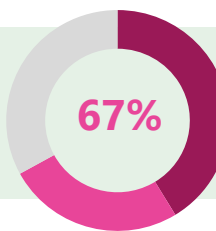

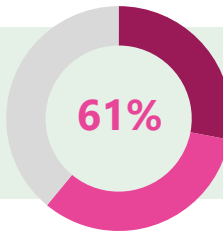

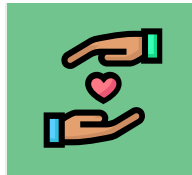
Perception of Crime



67% (177) of resident respondents felt that crime has increased nationally with 41.3% (109) that felt that crime has significantly increased....

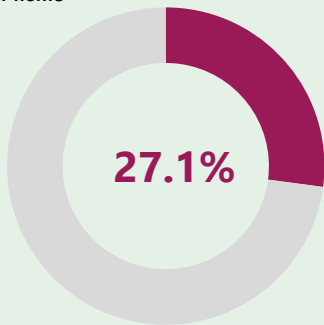
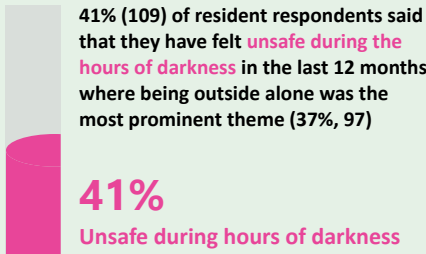
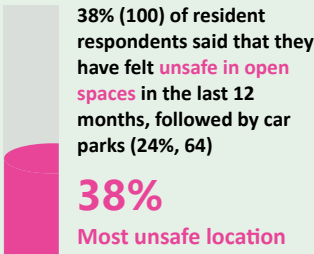


...compared to 61% (160) of resident respondents that felt that crime has increased locally with 28% (74) that felt that crime has significantly increased



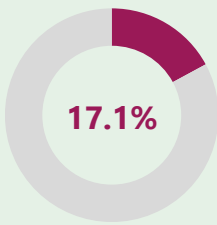
Feeling safe (Last 12 months)

Where "local area" is defined as 15-20 mins walking distance from your home

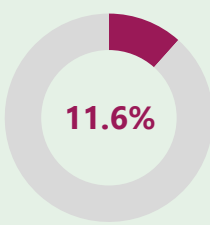


Feeling unsafe due to age

27.1% (35) of resident respondents who said that they felt unsafe in their local area over the last 12 months said that they had felt unsafe due to their **age** (however, this is a likely reflection of the older demographic completing the survey)

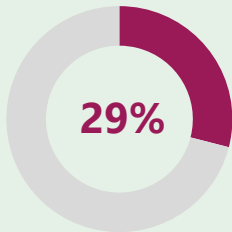
“ Car parks with loud groups hanging around in town centre. Anti social behaviour taking place as you want to walk past. Often taking alternate route as a result. Obvious drug taking in public.

“ Increased assaults, aggravated burglaries, knife crime and anti-social behaviour.
(Resident, Warwick District) ”

“ Visible criminality on streets and in parks, mainly **drug dealing**, which is intimidating when using public areas with young children.
(Resident, Warwick District) ”

“ Groups of **youths congregating** and showing no respect for area or residents.
(Resident, Warwick District) ”

“ Open spaces are not lit or designed with safety in mind for women and girls. Avoid some shops and entertainment venues due to anti social behaviour. Don't go into town after about 10pm due to anti social behaviour's. Local park has had several arson attacks over the years resulting in damage to property. Car crime is especially a problem locally. Dogs not under control are also a problem.

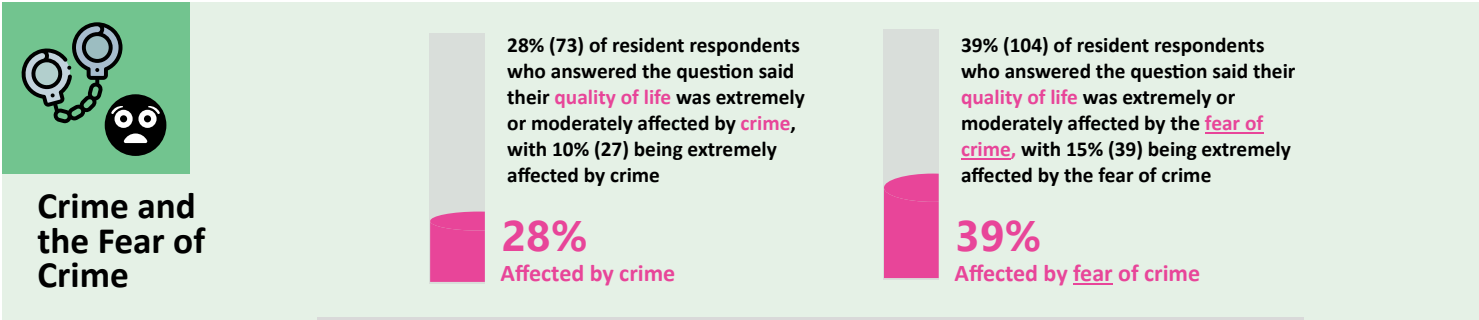

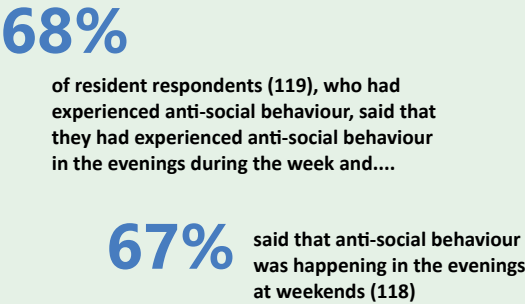
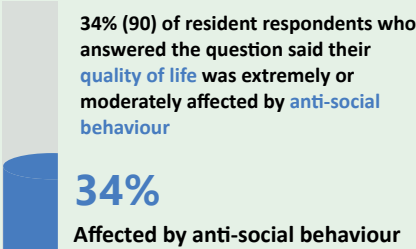
Having something stolen is the biggest worry for residents in Warwick District where 73% (192) of resident respondents were worried about this

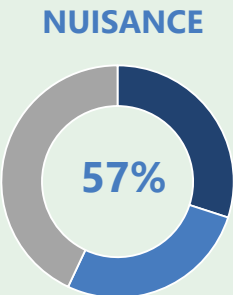


Anti-Social Behaviour

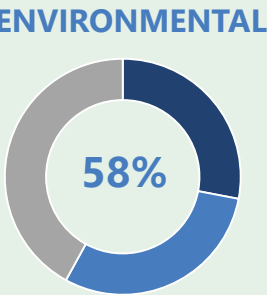


Perception of anti-social behaviour in the local area

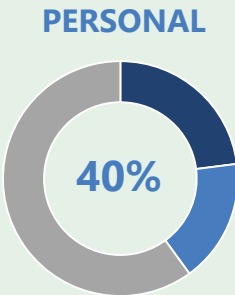
Where "local area" is defined as 15-20 mins walking distance from your home



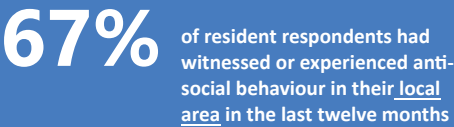
Overall, 57% (150) of resident respondents thought that 'nuisance' anti-social behaviour had **increased**, with 30% (80) feeling that it had **significantly increased**



58% (152) of resident respondents thought that 'environmental' anti-social behaviour had **increased**, with 28% (74) feeling that it had **significantly increased**



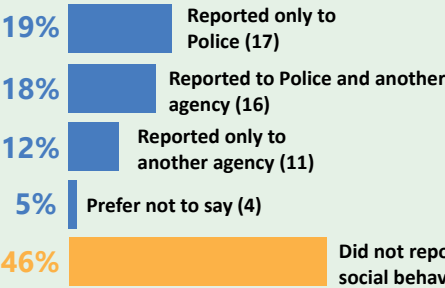
40% (105) of resident respondents thought that 'personal' anti-social behaviour had **increased**, with 23% (61) feeling that it had **significantly increased**



Reporting anti-social behaviour

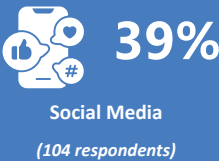
49%

Further Thoughts...

The most common theme to emerge in response to this freetext question by resident respondents was for increased **Police visibility**, either in the town centres or in the local community where they lived. Of resident respondents that answered this question, 40% (55, from a total of 139 respondents) mentioned this in their response to 'Further Thoughts'.

The second most common theme to emerge was **action being taken by Police and/or the Criminal Justice System**, where resident respondents wanted more action to be taken against criminal behaviour and anti-social behaviour, with stricter and longer punishments, where 14% (19) of resident respondents mentioned this in their response.

Comments from residents of.....

Warwick District

"More uniformed presence, more mobile and foot patrolling. More community get together and support."

"Pay more attention to anti-social behaviour on our streets. Speeding and excessive noise from motor vehicles is a blight on our community."

"Community safety has to include action on climate breakdown. This affects us all now & for all our futures."

"I think the main issues which bother me are increased litter and speeding. "

"Investment. Bring back Youth Clubs or similar, give the young somewhere to go, something to do, to get them off the streets in the evenings. Investment. Investment. Investment."

"Keep the street lights on to deter burglars. Take more action on shoplifting and especially those who abuse retail / hospitality workers . Do everything possible to deter people from carrying a knife - education from early ages , limit the availability of knives on line , but changing the mentality of a generation who see knife carrying as " essential " - I have no idea how you do that"

"As we live on the fringes of warwickshire we feel that we are forgotten by the police after reporting incidents"

"I prefer to avoid going into towns at night due to the fear of **antisocial behaviour**, which is frequently reported in the media. I am convinced that a **greater police presence** and a **zero tolerance approach** is needed, but this is a national issue as well as a local one."

"I believe there needs to be a greater visible **police** presence in Leamington Spa, wider **CCTV** coverage, and greater punitive measures against those who commit crime and anti-social behaviour.."

"I don't believe it's as bad as painted. Warwickshire always has been a safe County to live in, in my experience"
