
Abbey Fields Cycle Path Consultation Results





Consultation activities

Consultation took place between 7th May and 12th June 2025.

Submissions could be made online or via paper surveys left at Kenilworth Library or posted to Warwick District Council (WDC)

6 Consultation events were held at Kenilworth Library (2), Castle Farm Leisure Centre, Kenilworth Market (2) and Kenilworth Community Centre

The consultation was promoted via a number of channels including roadside banners, posters in shops in Kenilworth town centre, local newspapers, WDC and Kenilworth Town Council newsletters, local schools and social media including local Facebook groups.

The Council received 1,028 responses to the consultation, almost all from individuals (1009 - 98% of responses), 6 responses from families/couples, 8 from organisations and 5 from elected individuals (Question 1)
