

EXHIBITIONS

SIR TERRY FROST R.A. (1915-2003): A LEAMINGTON LAD 24 July – 11 October

In 1915 Terry Frost was born in
Leamington Spa. He grew up in a house
on Rugby Road, attended the Central
School on Leicester Street and did a
number of jobs in the town before war
broke out in 1939 and he was called
up. In 1941 he was imprisoned in the
Prisoner of War camp in Bavaria called
Stalag 383. There he met the artist
Adrian Heath and was inspired to paint.
In 1944 the Art Gallery & Museum staged
a small exhibition of paintings Frost had
sent back from the camp and when
he returned to Leamington in 1945 he

was determined to pursue a career in art. Later that year he married Kathleen Clarke and together they made the brave decision to move to St Ives, Cornwall, to become part of the artistic community which had developed there. Frost became one of the most famous abstract artists of the 20th century. He was elected a Royal Academician in 1992 and received a knighthood in 1998. Although he remained based in Cornwall for much of the rest of his life he maintained links with Leamington. A second exhibition at the Art Gallery & Museum took place

in 1964 and a third in 1996. In 1998 he donated a collection of works to the gallery which will be displayed for the first time in this exhibition. Two years later he received an honorary degree at Warwick University. This exhibition, in the year which marks the centenary of his birth, will be accompanied by a publication which focuses on Frost's early life and ongoing connection with his home town.




Haddie's Trails are designed to help families with young children explore the displays. The trails can be collected from the Art Gallery desk. There are four different themes to try.

NEW ACQUISITIONS

Samurai Sword



SAMURAI SWORD

This Samurai sword was surrendered by a Japanese officer at an official ceremony at Jahor Bahru, Malaysia, in 1946. The end of the war with Japan was first announced on 15 August 1945, but it was some time before all of the Japanese troops fighting in the Pacific surrendered.

The sword was given to Albert Edward Johns, who served in the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. After the war he settled with his family near Royal Leamington Spa. The sword was donated to Leamington Spa Art Gallery & Museum by his children in December 2014.



HOW TO FIND US



Learnington Spa Art Gallery & Museum is in the Royal Pump Rooms, on The Parade, opposite Jephson Gardens. If travelling by car, leave the M40 at Junction 13 and follow directions into Royal Learnington Spa on the A452.

The Royal Pump Rooms is a 10 minute walk from Leamington Spa Railway Station. There are direct rail services from London Marylebone, Birmingham, Oxford and Coventry.


PARKING

There is limited parking directly outside the Royal Pump Rooms. Parking is reserved for disabled visitors approximately 10 metres from the entrance. There is a drop off point for coaches on Newbold Terrace. St. Peter's car park is also walking distance from the Royal Pump Rooms.



ACCESS

The art gallery is on one level and the museum is on two levels, the upper level is accessible by stairs and usually by chairlift.
